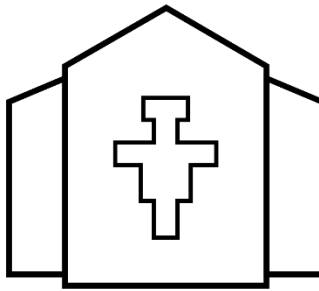



## **HOMILY**

### **PROFESSION OF FAITH**
